

BOB HOCK.....COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD for Education

The Bob Hock Award is named for a Past President, REALTOR, and Appraiser of the Hinesville Area Board of Realtors. Bob was a dedicated REALTOR and served the HABR with pride. During his term, we found what community involvement was all about. Having been prior military, Bob felt we needed to give back to the community in terms of involvement in numerous activities. One of those activities involved cleaning up the roadways leading to Hinesville, and making ourselves known to the community around us. He avidly promoted HABR to anyone he met, and was actively involved with the nearby military base in keeping us updated on what was occurring within the military in regards to the number of incoming or outgoing personnel.

Since Bob Hock was so involved in community awareness and involvement, it is very fitting that the recipient of the BOB HOCK AWARD be as involved and compassionate as he. While the award also carries an educational benefit, be it known that the recipient of this award shall hold themselves accountable to a higher level of involvement by making their knowledge in real estate education through the use of the scholarship for educational courses or designations. Said scholarship is good for one year only from the date of issuance or announcement, whichever occurs first. Application for the course or designation shall be made through the association Executive with the fee being paid up to a maximum of \$500.

HABR Community Service Guidelines:

Events:

1. The recipient must have been involved in a minimum of 2 HABR community events per calendar year.
2. Events are selected and determined by HABR directors and published to the general membership from which a member may select which to participate in.
3. Points are calculated and determined by the following method:
 - A. EVENT CHAIRPERSON---10 points (can be split with one co-chair) and so approved by Pres/Pres-Elect
 - B. Meeting for planning purpose = 2 pts per mtg and must be documented
 - C. Participation in the event on day held = 5 pts and must be documented
 - D. No limit on number events in which a member may participate

HABR SPONSORED CONTINUING EDUCATION:

1. Member may earn points toward continuing education by attending any HABR sponsored continuing education class carrying a minimum of 3 credit hours.
2. Points earned in this category are equivalent to the amount of CE Hours and member must produce a receipt or proof of attendance at class(es).

RPAC CONTRIBUTION:

1. Level 1 (\$1 - \$99) = 2 Points
2. Level 2 (\$100 - \$199) = 5 Points
3. Level 3 (\$200 +) = 10 Points

Affiliate Sponsorship

Any member who actively sponsors an affiliate to join HABR at any level shall receive 10 Points per Affiliate Organization/Name. Affiliate must register the applicant with management or Association Executive in order to receive the points. Le Law Firms count as one (not # in law firm)

HABR LUNCHEONS

Any member who attends monthly luncheons, awards banquets, and/or installation of officers shall accrue 2 points per occasion. Proof must be from sign in sheet or documented w/secretary's signature/date.

The award is open to any member, elected officer, director, or committee chair who is an active REALTOR and claims HABR as their PRIMARY Board of choice.

All points must be earned between January 1 and December 31 of given year. Points do not carry over to the following year.

By June 15, all participants seeking the award shall submit proof of hours and participation to be tabulated to determine the Top Ten Point Earners. Community Service Chairperson with a minimum of 5 selected HABR members, selected by the President, shall review the applicant's submission.

The midyear "TOP TEN POINT EARNERS" will be posted in July newsletter and will contain names only –not points earned.

Final Proof of participation by means tabulation sheets/charts, etc. are to be submitted to Community Service Chairperson by deadline so noted for Distinguished Sales Society Recipients, and other Special Awards (Realtor of Year, Rookie of Year and Affiliate of Year)

In case of a tie, a Special Committee will be selected and approved by the Board of Directors. The committee will be chosen as follows:

Shall consist of no less than 5 and no more than 7, and the Committee will representative of the different companies belonging to HABR as a PRIMARY Board. Primary consideration in breaking the tie shall be number of community activities member participated in and the number of education classes he or she attended.

The scholarship/community service awardee will be announced to the annual AWARDS Banquet or Luncheon.

A signed copy of the guidelines shall accompany the member's application page for consideration.\

Should any member have outstanding invoices for functions attended or events ...said invoice shall be paid in full prior to application for the award.
